You'll gain experience using the Notebook Toolbar and have the opportunity to explore the Notebook Gallery to find ready-made activities and resources to use in various classroom contexts. Furthermore, you'll be shown how to use the SMART Exchange to find learning resources and game templates, such as Koosh Ball activity, to add to your teaching repertoire.

Basic use of SMART Response devices (clickers) will also be demonstrated.
