She served for four years as Executive Director of the Canadian Institute of Reading Recovery. Susan authored 20 books in the guided reading series, The Porcupine Collection (Curriculum Plus), used in many Canadian and U.S. classrooms.

In her role as an education consultant, she brings a high level of knowledge and skill in teaching struggling readers to school systems across Canada. As a qualified trainer, facilitator and presenter, she works directly with teachers and school administrators on literacy issues.
